Fraction Wall- Create your own fraction wall using strips of paper (see video instructions).
Cut 3 strips of paper of equal lengths.
Strip 1: $\quad$ Write 1 unit on the $1^{\text {st }}$ strip, this will not be folded or cut.
Strip 2: $\quad$ Fold exactly in half and cut along the line.
Write the symbol for one half on both pieces.
