Continuing with the topic 'Time': You just need to remember that 1 hour is only 60 minutes. When you're adding, taking away and multiplying keep the hours and minutes separate.

It's always a good idea to have an analogue watch or clock face to look at and to practise reading the time from this regularly.

You can continue to make your own time sums at home. See how long some of your favourite films are in hours and minutes and change them to just minutes, add up how long it would take you to watch 3 episodes of your favourite show, write your own timetable of what you did for the day, figure out how long you spent doing different activities or how long you were awake for, make a timetable for the following day and try to stick to it, swap the times on your timetable from 12hr to 24hr clock, time how long it takes you to do different activities at home
