Suggested Work 18th – 22nd May

Phonics – Revision of letters a-z

As we have now completed all our letters of the alphabet this week will be dedicated to revision of all letter sounds and formations. Please take your time with your daughter, hold up the letters and see if she can recognise the letter sound and name. Can she form the letter while you hold up the letter for her? Make a list of the letters that might have been tricky for her and revise this list. The following resource will help this

- Fun action game hide letters around the house, ask your daughter to find the letter s....etc
- Letters which may have been tricky for your daughter can be formed using playdough, using pegboards, chalks etc.

Writing:

- Writing revision of all letters a-z. Can you write them?
- Writing news Please continue to write your news. This is a fantastic way to practice writing all of your letters. Short sentences such as 'Today is Monday. It is sunny.' or 'Today is Monday. I played bingo'. You can write these short sentences and ask the girls to copy them. If it is tricky, try writing one word at a time rather than a whole sentence at once. Then ask her to find a letter/word/full stop etc. Try to leave a finger-space between each word. Read your news. Best of luck!

Maths - Partitioning / Number

- Partitioning-This week we will be moving onto the new topic of partitioning. This is a very hands one activity, using what you've got at home beads / cubes / socks / sweets etc. Basically we are reinforcing your daughters visual and mental understanding of number 0-5. You will have 5 objects in a set and let your daughter split or part the set. For example 5 bears in a set maybe split (using a straw / ruler) into a subset of 2 bears and 3 bears. We can then say that 2 and 3 altogether makes 5. Or 3 and 2 altogether makes 5. Can we split the set any other way? 1 bear and 4 bears altogether makes 5 bears etc. When she gets very good at this stage of partitioning cover one side of the set and see if she can recall how many might be hiding underneath Remember we have 5 bears altogether, I can see 4 bears in this part of the set, I wonder how many bears are hiding in the rest of the set?

- Understanding Number Again using the same concept as above using a set / plate place an amount 0-5 in the set. Allow your daughter to look and count the objects, then cover and ask her how many did she see? Check her answer together. As she gets quicker at visually recognising the amount correctly make it a bit trickier by shortening her time.
- Understanding Number (Listening) Using beads or pegs drop an amount 0-5 in a saucepan or a tin. Don't let your daughter see you dropping the objects into the tin, get her to focus on listening and how many did you count / hear fall into the tin? These mental Maths skills are very important. It will some take time to get the hang of this, so a little bit every day and best of luck!
