Wednesday 6th May

English

- Activity 1
- Spellbound Unit 26 pg. 54 Learn spellings in Word List 1 and do activity A, B and C.
- Activity 2 Letter Writing
- This week we will be looking at the correct way in which to write a letter. Take a look at the template attached and using this to write me a short letter. Take a photo of your letter and upload it to your Journal.

Irish:

- Bua na Cainte Pg. 126.
 1. Look at the Irish words in the first two columns. Read them out loud twice.
 2. Now read the sentences in the far right column out loud.
 3. When you are ready try to spell the words in the “Litrigh” section without looking up at the words at the top.
 4. Read the sentence at the bottom of the page out loud. Now write your own in the space.
- Record your words and sentences using the microphone button on Seesaw and upload for your teacher to hear them.
- Take a picture of your work and upload it to your journal also.
- Listen to and enjoy the story of The Emperor’s New Clothes/ Eadaí Nua an Impire.

Maths

Daily worksheets this week are from their Busy at Maths school book, these can be printed off or if you don’t have the facility to do so, just do your best to copy the activities down or complete them online.

Busy at Maths P104

Using 3 objects e.g. tin of beans, bag of flour, a box of cereal, ask your child some questions based on these objects.

1. Do you think they weigh the same?
2. If they do not weigh the same why would that be?
3. Do you think they are full/empty?
4. Estimate/guess which object is the lightest/ heaviest.
5. Order the objects from lightest to heaviest.
6. Discuss size of the containers vs weight.

You can repeat this activity using various items like teddies, lego etc.

Activity 2

Write a letter to a classmate

I will give each girl in the class the name of another girl who they will write a letter to. Using the template from yesterday write a letter to this girl with the following:

1. Your address (you can make up an address for this exercise).
2. The date. 3. Dear
4. Three paragraphs, one asking your classmate how they are, two telling your classmate what you miss and three saying what you have been doing during lockdown.

5. Sign off your letter with From or Love or See you soon etc.

Take a photo of your letter and upload it to your Journal. I will correct the letter and give you some instructions on how to improve it for your second draft. Once the final draft is submitted, I will send the finished letter to whom it is addressed.

Irish:

- Bua na Cainte Pg. 127.
- 1. Read the colour words in the first two columns. Out loud!
- 2. Now read the sentences on the right. They use “ort” at the end of each sentence. This means “on you” e.g. Tá cóta ort = You are wearing a coat or The coat is on you.
- 3. When you think you are ready, challenge yourself by writing in the colour words without looking up at the top! See how many you get without looking 😊
- 4. Now read the sentence below out loud. Write your own sentences. Don't forget to put the correct colour in the sentence.
- Record yourself reading your colour words and sentences on your Seesaw Journal, using the microphone button.
- Take a picture and upload it to your Seesaw Journal also!
- Listen to and enjoy the story of The Emperor's New Clothes/ Eadaí Nua an Impire.

Maths: Busy at Maths P106

If possible, show your child a container weighing 1kg e.g. a bag of sugar. You could weigh out sand rice or flour into a ziplock bag if you need to.

1. Allow your child to feel the weight of 1kg in their hands.
2. Using other objects (apple, cup, pencil, book, shoe, yogurt, sock, sponge, spoon, tin of beans, stone) ask your child to guess/estimate if they weigh more/less/about the same as 1kg.

3. Using the 1kg weight in one hand and the object in the other they can compare each one and say “This is less than/ more than/ about the same as 1kg.
4. If you have a scale you can weigh each object and accurately check to see if her estimates were correct.

air= on him
uirthi= on her
1. Read the sentences aloud.
 2. Now look at the sentences and pictures at the end of the page. Look at what the arrow is pointing to. Write a sentence to match each picture. E.g. in No. 2 the arrow is pointing to the ‘léine’ and it is white (bán) and it is on him (air), so....Tá léine bán air.
 3. Record all the sentences using the microphone button on Seesaw and upload to your journal
 4. Take a photo of your page and upload to your journal also.
