

## Work for week beginning 11<sup>th</sup>-15<sup>th</sup> May '20

### Monday 11/5/20

#### Maths:

- Number Facts Pg. 56 Monday
- Busy at Maths Pg87

Ask your child to count in 10's from 10 to 190. As she says each number she alternates touching between two body parts e.g. Shoulders (10), knees(20), shoulders(30), knees(40) etc.

Expansion- Begin on different number jumping in 10.

Count backwards from different numbers.

Record yourself counting and send it to your teacher on seesaw.

#### Irish:

- Bua na Cainte Pg. 78
  1. Look at the picture of the house. Do you know how to say these rooms in Irish?
  2. Press play to listen to your teacher read out rooms that are at the bottom of the page. Echo the teacher
  3. Practise saying the different rooms out loud a few times
  4. Can you type the words onto the page on Seesaw using the T button?
- Record your words using the microphone button on Seesaw and upload for your teacher to hear them.
- Take a picture of your work and upload it to your journal also.
- Listen to and enjoy the story of The Emperor's New Clothes/ Eadaí Nua an Impire.

## **Maths:**

Play “I’m Thinking of a Number”. Tell your child the 3 digits of the number you have in mind, they must work out the number with the digits in the correct order. E.g. I’m thinking of a number with the digits 2, 6, and 0. They must guess the possibilities- 260, 620, 206, 602, 026, 062.

## **Irish:**

Activity One:

- Cá bhfuil Teidí? This is a set of posters that will teach us the prepositions in Irish for “under”, “on”, “in” and “between”.
1. Click on the posters on your Seesaw Activity and listen to your teacher reading the sentences.
  2. Practise yourself by reading them aloud
  3. Record yourself reading them and upload them to your Seesaw Journal.

Activity Two:

- Bua na Cainte Pg. 79
1. Look at the bedroom “Seomra Leapa”. Look at all the labels and try to read each word.
  2. Press play and listen to your teacher read each label. Echo the teacher and please say the words out loud a few times to get used to them.
  3. Now listen to the eight sentences read by your teacher. You can pause my voice at any stage.
  4. Write the words that are missing in each sentence.
- Record yourself reading sentences on your Seesaw Journal, using the microphone button.
  - Take a picture and upload it to your Seesaw Journal also!
  - Listen to and enjoy the story of The Emperor’s New Clothes/ Eadaí Nua an Impire.
