Busy at Maths Pg87

Ask your child to count in 10's from 10 to 190. As she says each number she alternates touching between two body parts e.g. Shoulders (10), knees(20), shoulders(30), knees(40) etc.

Expansion- Begin on different number jumping in 10.

Count backwards from different numbers.

Record yourself counting and send it to your teacher on seesaw.

### **Tuesday 12/5/20**

Busy at Maths Pg88

Play "I'm Thinking of a Number". Tell your child the 3 digits of the number you have in mind, they must work out the number with the digits in the correct order. E.g. I'm thinking of a number with the digits 2, 6, and 0. They must guess the possibilities- 260, 620, 206, 602, 026, 062.
