ART:

The Aztec civilisation lasted from 1300 AD to 1521 AD. They built Mexico City and made human sacrifices to their sun god. This week I would like you to try drawing and colouring an Aztec Sun Stone. The Aztec

Sun Stone was an enormous calendar that was 12 feet high, 4 feet thick and weighed 24,000 tons! The Aztec calendar was different from our calendar today because it had 18 months each containing 18 days in a year.

You can use whatever medium you prefer to colour it. It looks fabulous with oil pastels if you have some. Otherwise markers, paint or crayons are fine. Have a look here and see if you can create your own. You should create half of your sun using wavy or curved lines and the other half using straight lines. Then colour half of the sun with warm colours such as red, yellow orange and the other half with cool colours such as blue, green and purple.
